Uniforms & Dress Code

<u>We are a uniform school.</u> Our expectation is that all students come to school in uniform daily. Our school uniform includes:

Pants/Shorts/Skirts: Solid tan khaki or navy blue or black pants, jeans without holes, shorts, skorts, skirts, capris. Pants/shorts etc. should not have any wording/graphics down the sides or across the back. A Belt must be worn with pants/shorts. Students without belts may receive a zip tie or rope to secure pants.

Shirts Uniform: Shirts are solid polo shirts of the following colors: Red, White, or Navy-blue Polo shirt. Shirts must have collar.

Close-toed shoes: Student safety is priority and student must wear shoes that do not reveal their toes. If Crocs are worn, straps are to be in "sports mode" to prevent accidents on campus.

On Fridays: Students may wear any official Shaw spirit shirt with jeans, which should have no rips, holes, and skin is completely covered.

Dress Up Days: Students will have the opportunity to have days when they will be asked to dress up. Parents will be notified of dress up days through parent links and flyers.

Students are rewarded daily with PBIS points for wearing school uniforms. Students who are not in uniform will be asked to change into a uniform from our closet, and their other clothes will be sent home. Parents will be contacted if a student comes without a uniform more than one time.

<u>All students must wear closed-toed shoes daily</u>. No uncovered shoulder tops, muscle shirts, middrifts with expose belly, sagging pants, exposed underwear, ripped jeans with exposed legs, unacceptable mini-skirts or short shorts that are higher than students' fingertips placed on their legs, sandals or flipflops of any kind are acceptable. If students violate this policy, parents will be called in to bring students appropriate school attire.

Daily Arrival and Dismissal Procedures



Arrival 7:10-7:40 AM:

Students may begin arriving on campus at 7:10 a.m. Upon entering, students will be directed to get a grab-and-go breakfast (if desired) and go directly to their classroom. The late bell rings at 7:40 a.m. for all students. Students are not allowed to stop and visit other classrooms. *Subject to change if waiver votes approve breakfast in the cafeteria.*

***Students who arrive after 7:40** must be escorted by their parent/guardian to the main office to request a tardy pass.

CLOSED CAMPUS/RESTRICTED ACCESS:

Due to the Marjorie Stoneman Douglas Act, all HCPS campuses are considered closed campuses with restricted access during student hours. This is for the safety of our students and staff. ***Parents will NOT be allowed to walk students into their classrooms this year, except for the first three days of school.** This is a district policy. Students will not be allowed to walk their siblings to their classrooms. We will have an abundance of staff on campus during the week to assist students to their classrooms.

Dismissal Times:

- Dismissal begins at 1:55 p.m. and 12:55 on Mondays (early release)
- Please be prompt in picking your children up each day.

<u>Change in Dismissal:</u> If there is a change in dismissal, and you as the parent/guardian are changing the way that your child goes home, please send a note with your child to provide to an office staff member. Another option can be in email as we would need change of dismissal in writing and/or documentation. You may email <u>beatriz.tovar@hcps.net</u> We will not accept calls made over the phone. The office staff member will then notify the teacher once we receive documentation of your child's change in dismissal. This is extremely important for safety and liability reasons.



Bus Riders:

Parents are responsible for getting their child to and from the bus stop safely. Please be sure to choose the bus stop closest to your home that provides the safest walk path. Bus stops are for buseligible students only. Eligibility is determined based on the child's home address on record at the school. If you have moved, please make sure to update your address with your child's school immediately.

Parents/guardians of Kindergarten students must be present at the bus stop. Kindergarten students are not allowed off the bus if an adult is not present. Kindergarten students with siblings at Shaw

cannot be responsible to walk their sibling home.

To assist families with locating the school bus. Please download the "**Here Comes the Bus**" **app** – a Synovia Cal/Amp GPS system tracks our bus fleet. The GPS system does not track students.

When a student scans their Student Ridership ID card as they enter or exit the bus, there is no ability to further identify a child's location off the school bus. There are no RFID card readers inside our schools. The only location where an RFID reader will be utilized is on the school bus.

<u>Car Rider Line</u>: The car rider line is located at the front of the building facing the parking lot near Copeland Park. You will be directed to pull up to the closest numbered space. After your child is securely in your vehicle, please follow the prompts given by the staff to exit the parking lot safely. **Parents are not permitted to get out of their car at any time or park and walk up to pick up a child. Children will only be released to parents who are in the car line.** All vehicles (except for Pre-K) should remain in the car line for the safety of our students. **We will not release students to parents who are out of their vehicle (PreK is the only exception).**

Car Dismissal I.D Tag.

• A Car Dismissal I.D. Tag will be provided to in the front window of your car.

• Place the Car Dismissal I.D. Tag in the front window of your car.

• Write the first and last name of each child being picked up. Include the grade level.

• Follow the path to the pick-up and drop off points. Move as far forward as possible before you stop to let your child out or pick up your child. • Direct your child not to step out of your car or off the sidewalk until your car has stopped moving.

• Drive away from the pick-up area slowly. If you remember something at the last minute, please drive to a parking space. Please do not block traffic.

• Cars should not be left unattended and/or parked in the car rider line.

<u>Walkers:</u> Parents may greet their children at the gate in front of the school directly to the right of the main office. Please use the **provide walker tag** to verify your permission to pickup and help us easily match you with your child. **Only pre-K parents are the only parents allowed to park and walk up to get their child at dismissal.** <u>All other car pick-ups should use the carline.</u> Students will check out Revised July 2024

with their teachers first then be released to approved adults waiting outside of the front gate. If you give your child permission to walk home without a parent/guardian present, please communicate this to your child's teacher.

Sign-In and Sign-Out Procedures

<u>Sign-In Procedures:</u> Any student arriving to school after 7:40 a.m. MUST sign in the main office **with a parent or guardian** and receive a tardy pass before heading to class. Parents may not walk their child to class once instruction has begun at 7:40.

<u>Sign-Out Procedures</u>: During school hours the principal or designee shall permit a child to leave school only in the custody of the following adults:

Legal Guardian of the student, with a valid photo ID or person listed on emergency contact card, with photo ID. **No sign-outs will be allowed between 1:25-1:55 as we prepare for dismissal**. This is for the safety of all of our students. Regular dismissal is at 1:55 pm. We appreciate your cooperation as we strive to maintain the safety of our students and the accuracy of our dismissal procedures.

*Sign-outs do interrupt classroom instruction and should be limited to emergencies and critical appointments. Please limit early sign outs and make every attempt to schedule your child's appointments outside of school hours.

Attendance Matters



Your child attendance matters and it critical to your child's success at Shaw! Help us make this a priority by sending them to school on time every day. Good habits set the stage for academic success throughout high school and research shows that students who attend regularly perform better academically. **Our goal is for all students to attend 90% or more of the time in class**. This means limiting absences to less than 1 out of every 10 days (2 weeks) on average. When student attendance falls below 90%, a member or our Student Services team will contact you to create a plan to improve attendance. Chronic absenteeism may warrant, calls home, parent/teacher conference, a letter from the Principal or courtesy home visit from the Social Worker or designee.

Please help us protect instructional time by making every effort to schedule appointments and vacations outside of school hours. The only reason a child should be absent is when they are sick or have a family emergency. If your child does need to miss school, please contact our office at (813) 975-7366 to verify the absence and request it to be excused. Documents to excuse your child's absence can be sent to your child's teacher or to our main office.

Home School Communication

Parent Links– provides information via voice message, text, and email. These are sent from Ms. Copeland. We will also send **Text Message** reminders or event updates as needed. **Updated phone numbers and email addresses are needed for this communication*

PeachJar- the district and Shaw will be using the HCPS PeachJar program to email electronic flyers to you using the email we have on file for you. **Email address needed for this communication*

Twitter- Follow us on Twitter @THEShawElem for the latest and greatest happenings on campus! We use this more frequently than all other forms of communication so you don't want to miss out!

Student Folders–used daily to communicate assignments, behavior and important events. Question: Will we have a standard K-5 Communication folder that goes home every Thursday or Tuesday, etc.

Important! The contact information you provide on your **child's emergency card** is what we use to contact you. Please keep it up to date. Working phone numbers and email addresses are critical **to** ensure students' success daily.

Procedures for Volunteering and Chaperoning



If you plan to volunteer in your child's classroom, chaperone or attend field trips, or be an active member of the PTA, you <u>MUST complete an HCPS Volunteer Application online and be</u> <u>approved</u> for the current school year. Please see important information below. Once completed, please contact our main office to confirm approval of your volunteer application. You can apply to volunteer at <u>Volunteer Services / Overview (hillsboroughschools.org)</u>

The HCPS web-based Volunteer Application opens to all volunteers on July 1st. All volunteers and community partners must complete the HCPS online Volunteer Application <u>each school year</u>. Anyone who submits a volunteer application beginning July 1 will remain active in our system through June 30 or end of the fiscal year. A new application is available on July 1, the start of a new school year.

Birthdays and Celebrations

Birthdays are very important, especially for school-age children! We do allow parents to send in a small treat (cupcake, cake, etc.) to be passed out during the child's regular lunch time. We <u>do not</u> <u>allow</u> any celebrations in the classroom that otherwise interfere with instructional time. If you would like to send in a small treat to celebrate your child's birthday, please contact your child's teacher to arrange for the treats to be given during the class' lunch time.

Any cupcakes or other treats must be store bought and include the original label with list of ingredients. Several students have food allergies and the labels must be checked prior to distributing to students. For this reason, homemade treats cannot be shared with other students.

Illness and Health Concerns

If your child becomes ill or injured during the school day and requires a visit to the nurse, she will contact you if your assistance is needed. In fairness to your child and to others, it is critical that we have the following information on file:

- 1. Current phone numbers for parents/guardians (at least 2 numbers)
- 2. **Emergency numbers** of relative, friend or neighbor, should your child need immediate care and you cannot be reached.

If it is determined that the child is too ill to stay at school, please make sure that someone is available to pick the child up from school as soon as possible. **Students with fevers of 100.5 degrees or higher will not be allowed to remain on campus.** We will need your assistance with immediate pick up. It is school district policy that a child must be fever free (or diarrhea) for at least 24 hours before returning to school. This helps us keep all students healthy and limits the virus from spreading.

Please communicate all health concerns to the school, and a member of Student Health Services team will contact you with how the school can support your child on campus to be successful.

School Behavior Policy

We are a PBIS school and will reinforce this Culture for Learning school wide. PBIS, as our Tier 1 Behavior system will provide students with a solid behavior foundation to make positive choices, and it will provide opportunities for students to be rewarded throughout the school year for following our school-wide behavior expectations. As students earn PBIS reward points during the day, each month students will be allowed to spend these points on various incentives, such Bulldog Store, Glow parties, cafeteria fund days, etc.

We firmly believe in the right of every child to have the best academic instruction and a positive classroom environment. Our Schoolwide expectations include:

- 1. Be Safe
- 2. Be Respectful
- 3. Be Responsible

All school and classroom rules align to these 3 expectations. Students who follow these expectations will be rewarded using our point system, and students who do not follow these expectations will receive consequences, parent contact/conferences, and additional behavioral supports.

When students are making the unhealthy behavior choices, it impacts the learning of all students. There are some behaviors that <u>will not</u> be tolerated on our campus. Students who engage in behaviors such as fighting, destruction of property, using profanity and/or continual classroom disruption will be sent to the office where fair and appropriate consequences will be received.

Bullying Behavior



Shaw has a Zero Tolerance for bullying. Please report any bullying behavior immediately to your child's teacher and/or a school administrator. We do take all bully reports very seriously and will investigate the situation immediately.

Student Cell Phones on Campus



Per Florida statute, students are allowed to carry cell phones with them to school in case of emergency. However, if a student has a cell phone in their possession, our policy is that it should be put away and turned off (or on silent mode) and only to be used in case of a true emergency. Any student who is using a cell phone at school without permission will be asked to place the phone in their backpacks. If the phone continues to be used without permission, we may request to take the cell phone until a

parent or guardian can be notified.

Parent Visitation on Campus

While we welcome parent involvement and will host several events this year, instruction is always our top priority during school hours; therefore, we ask that you limit parent visitations on campus during instructional hours. On certain occasions we allow parents to visit their child but ask that these visits be reserved for special circumstances in order to protect our instructional time. We also ask that outside food not be brought to students during school hours.



School Meal Information

We are pleased to inform you that Hillsborough County Public Schools is implementing a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for school year 2024-2025. All students enrolled at Shaw may participate in the breakfast and lunch program at no charge, without meal benefits application.

Please encourage your child to eat breakfast and lunch daily. Students will have breakfast in the classroom. They will pick up the breakfast from breakfast carts on their way to their classroom. Kindergarten students will eat breakfast in the cafeteria upon arrival to school. The breakfast carts will be identified by grade level and in close proximity to classroom pods.

Breakfast is served **free** daily for all students regardless of eligibility status. We have a variety of choices daily and encourage all students to take advantage of the free breakfast provided. Please arrive prior to 7:30 for breakfast so that your child has enough time to eat before instruction begins.

Lunch Meal Cost: *free* for 2023-24 (grant funded for this year only) Lunch applications are not needed this year. However, you may submit a free/reduced lunch application online at <u>http://www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/doc/list/student-nutrition-services/free-reduced-lunch-application/53-648/</u>

Snack Bar is also provided as a voluntary option for students. Money can be added to your child's account to be used for snack bar ala carte items. Please contact our lunchroom manager for more information.


Water Bottles

Our water fountains are mostly located outside of the classrooms and not easily accessible or n the cafeteria during lunch. For this reason, please send your child to school daily with a refillable water bottle to stay hydrated during the school day. We do have water refill stations on campus and will allow them to refill as needed during the school day.



Parent-Teacher Conferences

Typically, we have 3 Parent Conference Nights scheduled each year. These conference nights provide an opportunity for you to learn about your child's academic progress. Teacher conferences can be requested by parents outside of these scheduled events if there are any concerns whatsoever. Our goal is to have ongoing two-way communication with all of our families in order to provide the best education to our students. If you ever have concerns about your child's progress, please feel free to contact your child's teacher.


