In today's world it is important that there be a strong educational partnership between parents, school and community. We all have the same goal for your child to achieve at his/her highest potential.

The School District of Hillsborough County's Vision is "Preparing Students for Life". Pinecrest Elementary supports this vision and continues to hold high expectations for our students and our staff. With this year's theme: "Destination Learning", Pinecrest Elementary will strive to reach our vision "To be a learning community where everyone achieves success". No matter what mode of learning you choose, our focus will remain on learning as we Go, Grow, Know, & Show together. Our students will take center stage as they take the lead role in their learning so that one day they will walk across their own stage at graduation. We are dedicated to providing an engaging atmosphere in which your child will thrive academically and be excited to come to school every day whether on campus or through eLearning.

In addition to excellent academic opportunities, we pledge to provide a safe environment for your child/children. Here are some important information about keeping Pinecrest healthy and safe:

Campus Access:

- Visitors to campus will be restricted to the front office only, Parents/guardians may come in to pick up an ill student or receive information from the office only.
- To maintain a safe and healthy environment, students will walk to class with the assistance of staff members. Parents/guardians will not walk students to class or the lunchroom.

Cleanliness Procedures

- Classrooms will be thoroughly disinfected every afternoon as well as intermittently throughout the day.
- Students are encouraged to wear mask.
- Students will each have their own learning materials.
- Extra spacing will be used in the classrooms and cafeteria.
- Hand sanitizer stations are available across the campus.
- Students will be encouraged to wash/disinfect their hands multiple times during the day.
- Students will learn about the importance of healthy habits and procedures.

<u>Arrival</u>

- Student drop off is located in front of the main office using the paved car line to enter through the back of the parking area.
- Instruction begins promptly at 7:40 am. All students should be present and, in their classroom, no later than this time.
- Busses ONLY are allowed in the bus ramp from 7:10-7:40 am. If your child rides a bus, please be at the bus stop 10-15 minutes early to greet the bus.

<u>Dismissal</u>

- Dismissal is at 1:55 p.m. for all K-5th grade students. Students may be signed-out early until 1:25 p.m. Tuesday-Friday or 12:25 p.m. on early release Mondays.
- All Pre-K students dismiss in the car line at 1:40 p.m. Only Pre-K cars may enter the car loop before 1:55 p.m.
- K-5th grade cars will enter through the back gate of the car line at 1:55 p.m. A staff member will check and collect tags and call for students to line behind the double doors.
- Students will only be released to those listed on the emergency card. This is for your student's safety.
- For the safety of all students, a child's mode of transportation may not be changed over the phone. We must have a written note.

Volunteer

- Volunteer access will be extremely limited for the safety of our students and staff.
- Due to limited access to campus, volunteers may only be on campus with approval when specific projects are going on (i.e. fundraisers).
- All volunteers must complete a new application each school year. New forms are available after July 1 at www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/doc/1532 . When volunteering, please do not bring younger children with you.

Student academic success is the main goal of every staff member at Pinecrest. We ask for your support and participation in this effort by sending your child to school or logging onto eLearning every day, encouraging your child to read at least 20 minutes every evening, monitoring your child's homework, and asking your child to share what they learned each day. Be sure to stay connected and maintain constant communication with the teacher regarding your child's progress.

Once again, we welcome you to another wonderful school year. I cannot tell you how much I appreciate this community and our families. I know you understand how deeply the staff at Pinecrest cares about our students and how seriously we take their health and safety coupled with academic strides.
