Novel Options (Choose 1)

Journal Entry Options

Author's Purpose/Determine Importance	Consider the author's purpose in including this chapter. Give 3 reasons why the author might have included it – think of character development, theme, plot, etc.
Text Connections	Select an event or character from the chapter. What/who does it remind you of? You could connect to a personal event, current event, or something else you have read. Explain your reasoning.
Predicting	Make 3 predictions or "best guesses" about what will happen next. Predictions are based on prior knowledge and experience about the topic. Explain your reasoning.
Visualizing	Create images that reflect or represent the ideas in the text. These images may include any of the five senses and serve to enhance understanding of the text. Printed images from the internet are not permitted.
Questioning	Consider what you read and its significance to the story. During and after reading the passage, write 3 questions related to the text.
