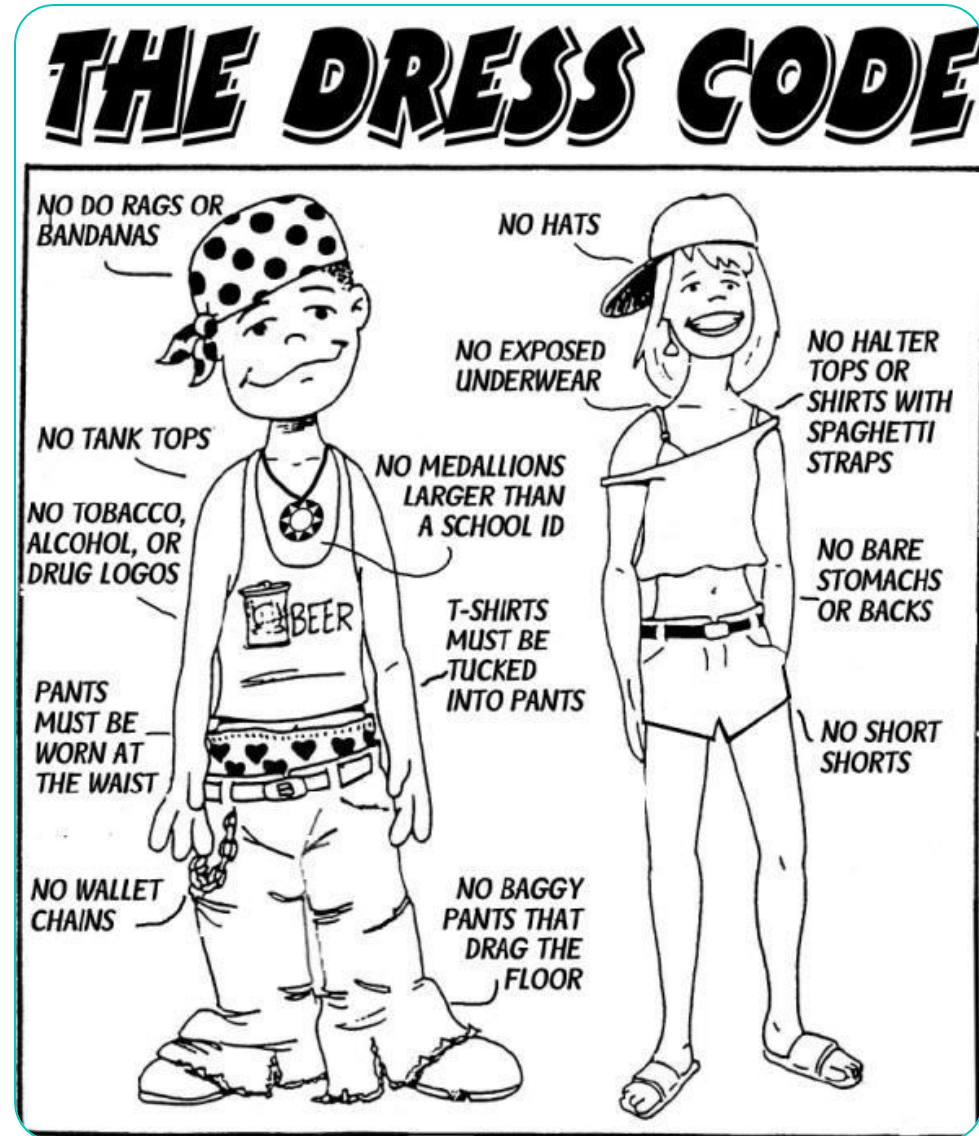

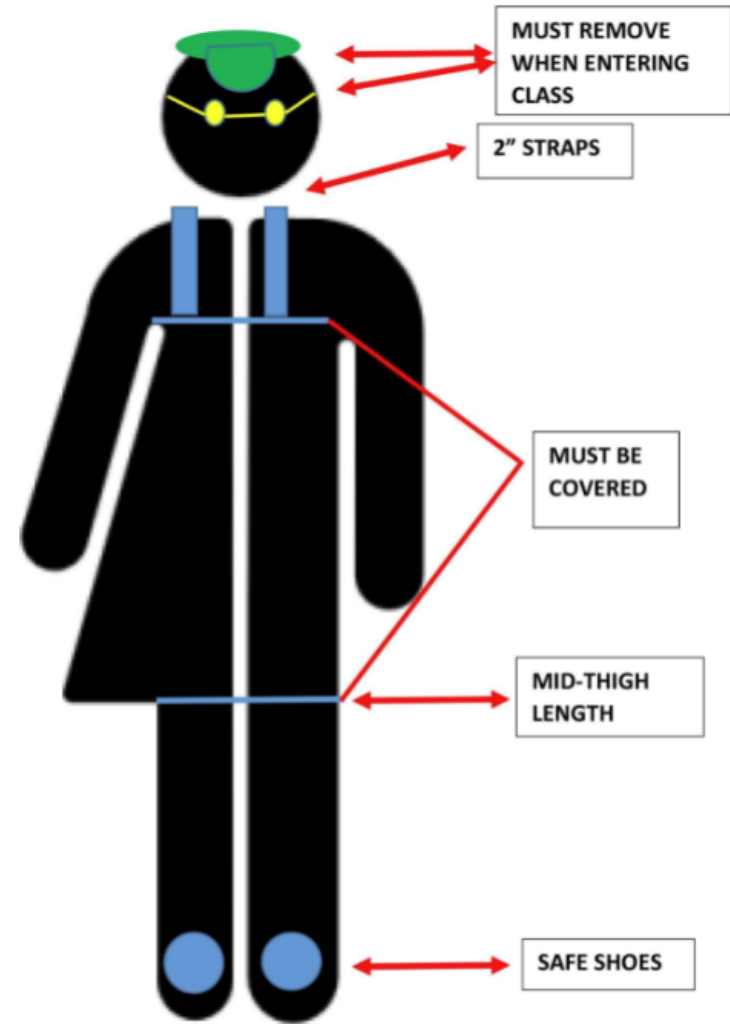
Dress Code

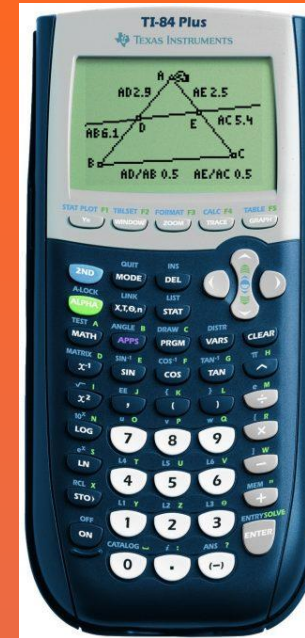
Jewelry or clothing may not have dangerous spikes or chains.

Student Schedules

All students will have 7 classes

5 Core Courses:

- ❖ English
- ❖ Math (Determined based on current math class, previous math grades, and scores on state math exams)
- ❖ Science (based on current science class and grades on state exams)
- ❖ Reading (EVERY freshman has a reading class)
- ❖ Social Studies (World History)

2 Elective Courses:

- ❖ AP, Career Technical, Music, Art, PE

Student Schedules

All students will have 7 classes

- Juniors and Seniors can be considered for partial schedules **ONLY** IF they are 100% on track for graduation.
- Students who have failed classes will not be considered for having periods off in the future in their junior and senior years.
- Students are **NOT** guaranteed spaces in Summer School or Credit Recovery. Both programs are by invite only based on the number of spaces given to us. You should **NOT** plan on using either program to make up failed credits.
- Passing classes the first time is the best thing you can do.

Graduation Requirements- Credits

❖ 24 Credits

- ❖ English – 4 Credits (English I, II, III, IV)
- ❖ Math – 4 Credits (Algebra I, Geometry, and 2 others)
- ❖ Science – 3 Credits (Biology I and 2 others)
- ❖ Social Studies – 3.5 Credits (World History, US History, US Government (0.5), and Economics (0.5) and Personal Financial Literacy (0.5))
- ❖ Fine Art or CTE – 1 Credit
- ❖ HOPE (Health Opportunities through Physical Education) – 1 Credit
- ❖ Electives – 7.5 Credits

Graduation Requirements- Other requirements

- ❖ World Language – 2 Credits in SAME language necessary for admission into 4-year universities. Not graduation requirement
- ❖ 2.0 UNWEIGHTED STATE GPA
- ❖ Must take the Biology, Geometry, and US History EOCs (the EOC is worth 30% of a student's final grade)
- ❖ Must earn a Level 3 on the Algebra 1 EOC (or receive a concordant score on the PSAT, SAT, ACT, or CLT)
- ❖ Must earn a Level 3 on the 10th grade State Reading FAST test (or receive a concordant score on the SAT, ACT, or CLT)
- ❖ Acceleration — Pass an AP or AICE exam, a Dual Enrollment course, or Industry Certification test

GPA determined by Semester Grades

○ Semester 1

- First Nine Weeks
- Second Nine Weeks
- Exam

○ Semester 2

- Third Nine Weeks
- Fourth Nine Weeks
- Exam or EOC

Students must have a 2.0 UNWEIGHTED STATE GPA in order to graduate

Dual Enrollment Courses

- Freshmen cannot take Dual Enrollment until 2nd semester of their freshmen year.
- The only class Freshmen are allowed to take is First Year Experience (SLS1106)
- Students can take DE classes and earn Community College and High School Credit.
- To enroll in a DE course, students must have a 3.0 STATE GPA.
- Courses are offered at PCHS and at HCC. If taking these courses at HCC, they must be scheduled outside of your 7- period schedule.
- Dual Enrollment courses add to a student's WEIGHTED GPA if they earn a "C" or better in the course.

Cambridge AICE Program

- Advanced International Certificate of Education - AICE
- Cambridge Pathway
- Acceleration course options
- Students can earn an AICE diploma after successful completion of 7 courses AND their corresponding exams.
- Must be done in three years

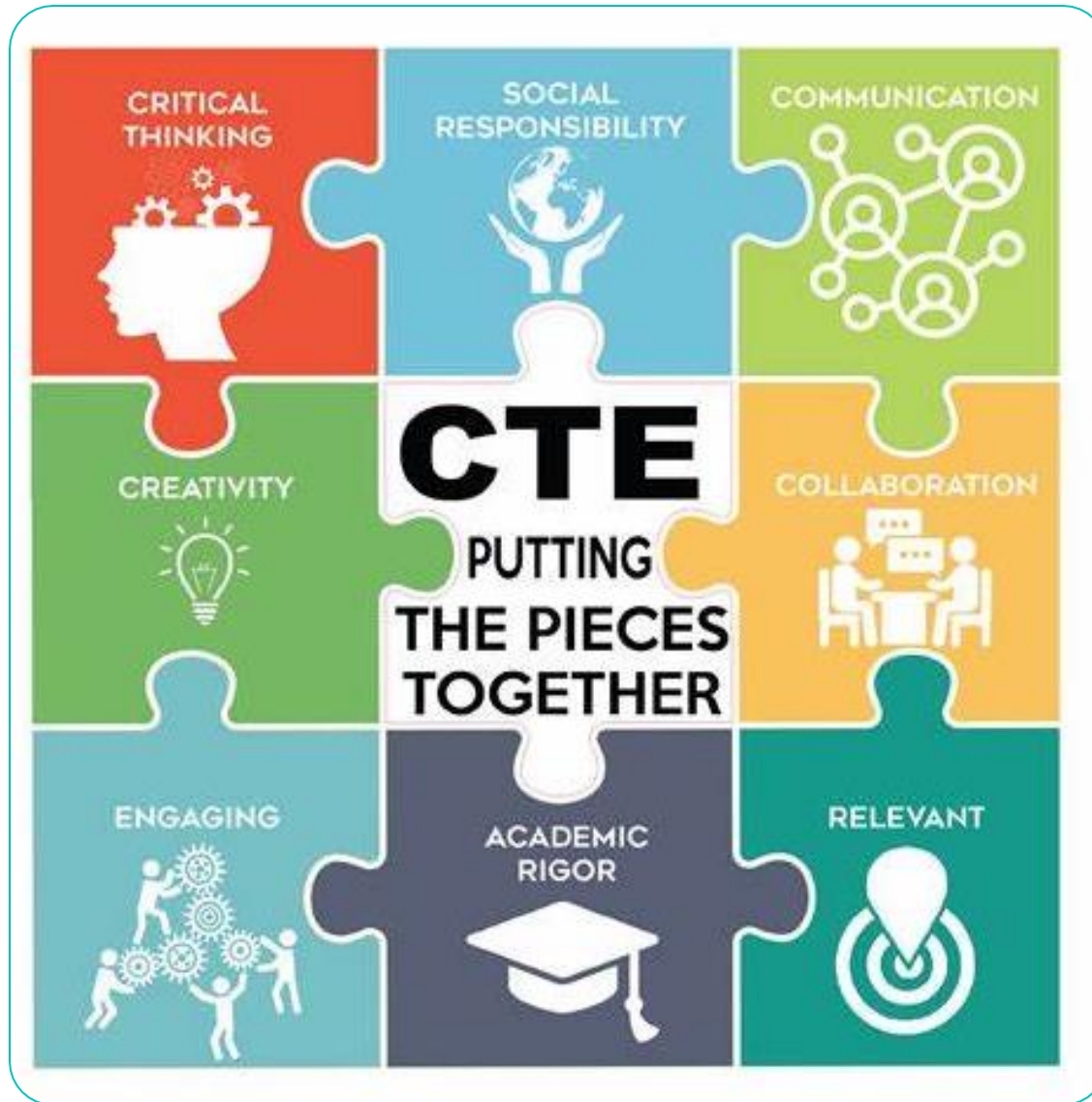
- College Credit (similar to AP and Dual Enrollment)

- Weighted coursework - courses can increase your District GPA each semester based on your grade in class.
- AICE diplomas qualify students for Bright Futures - 100% (without SAT/ACT requirement)
- Earns Acceleration for students when they successfully complete coursework/exam
- Can be offered at any grade level and in multiple content areas.

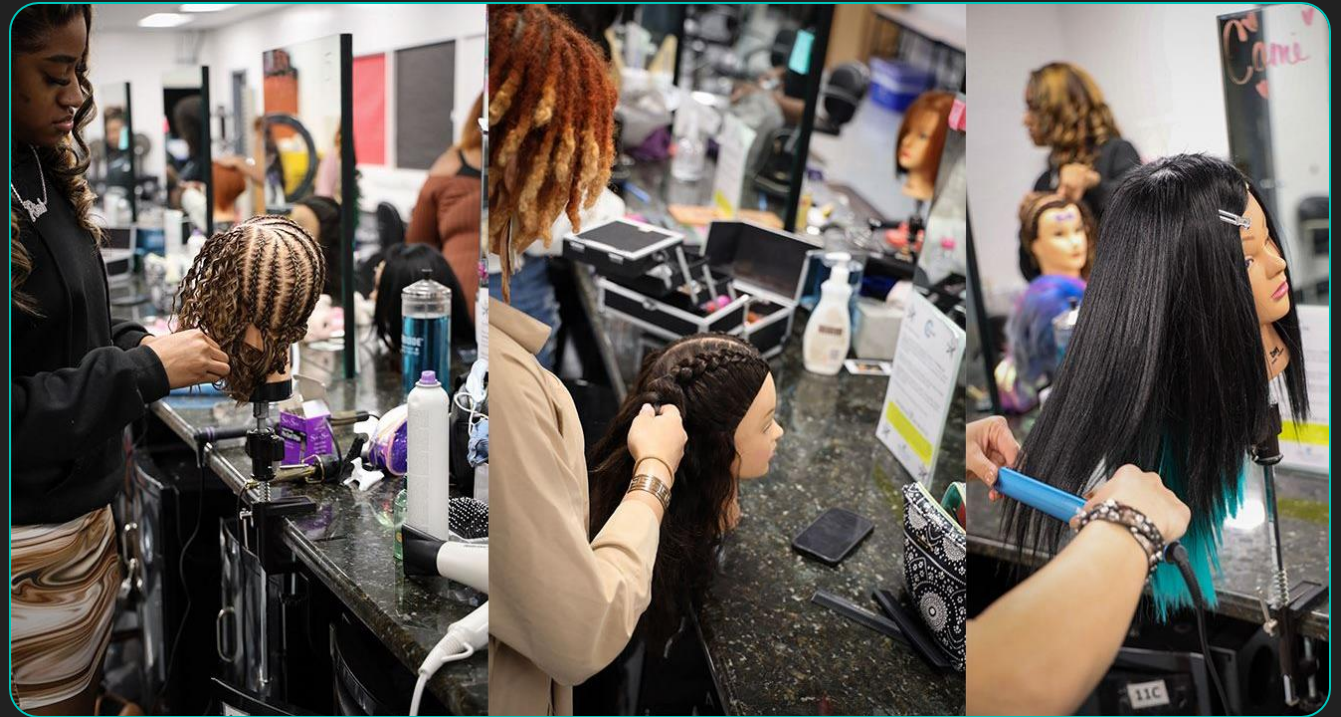

Important Issues for 9th Grade

- Goal – Graduate in 4 years – no 5-year plan
- GPA -9th graders that finish freshmen year with a 2.0 STATE GPA or higher are 95% more likely to graduate
- If GPA falls below a 2.0, students won't qualify to participate in extra-curricular activities (athletics and clubs)

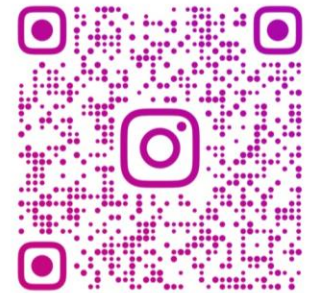
