






NEW HCPS ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY!

As in school districts nationwide, HCPS has a strict cell phone and electronic use policy. This applies to all personal electronics including (but not limited to) cell phones, earbuds, headphones, smartwatches, tablets, gaming devices, etc.

Simply put, there are only 3 times of the day that students may use, have out, or be wearing their devices:

- 1. Before school
- 2. During the student's scheduled lunch time
- 3. After dismissal


INTERVENTIONS AND CONSEQUENCES ARE IN PLACE

Students will be redirected and given one chance to comply: They must turn off/silence AND put away the devices in their book bag.

Students will be issued an incident infraction or office referral.

Students will lose privileges and/or serve detentions or lunch detail.

Devices will be confiscated and returned to parent or guardian via face-to-face conference.



Attendance

How does September attendance relate to chronic absence for the year?

A small proportion of students (12.6%) who missed fewer than 2 days in September went on to be chronically absent.

In contrast, nearly half (49.5%) of those missing 2 to 4 days in September went on to be chronically absent, and 87.8% of students absent for more than 4 days in September were chronically absent over the whole school year.

Students who missed 2 to 4 days in September were 5 x more likely than those who missed fewer than 2 days to be chronically absent for the year!

Campus Arrival Procedures

Middleton is GROWING! We have reached approximately 1600 students entering campus between 7:45 AM and 8:30 AM. Our morning procedures provide adequate supervision for ALL students in common areas. Please read all procedures carefully to help ensure a safe and smooth start to each day! Student supervision begins at 7:45 AM.

General Arrival Information

ALL buildings will remain closed to students until the gates open at 7:45 AM. Gates will close promptly at 8:45 AM. Students arriving after 8:45 AM must check-in through our main office. Students will be provided a tardy pass to class. In the event of severe weather, students will be admitted to the buildings prior to 7:45 AM.

Student Drivers & Staff

Only cars with Middleton Issued Parking Tags can park in the north campus parking lot. (Skills Center Side) Please complete the application and return to student service office. Students may not park on campus unless they have been issued a parking tag and it is displayed on their rear-view mirror or dash. Tardy students that are drivers will check-in walk around the building and report to the front office. Student drivers are subject to losing their parking pass for repeated tardies.

Student Drop-Off

Enter student parking and drop off student nearest to baseball field DO NOT USE FRONT ENTRANCE this is for our Special needs parents and walkers. Be patient and kind with each other and with the Middleton staff.

Walkers, Bike Riders, Scooter and Skateboards

The front gates between the main office and the student parking gate open at 7:45 AM. We do not have covered storage for bikes, scooters, skateboards or other modes of transportation. Please plan accordingly! We do provide bike racks and every student should bring a lock to secure their bike (boards and scooters) to the racks and or surrounding fence.





Schedule Change Requests

Parents and Students,

First and foremost, we want to thank our students and parents for their patience with schedule change requests. We have received over 500 requests.

Students select courses in the spring for the upcoming school year. Once course counts are calculated, allocations (Teacher positions and course sections) are determined based on requests.

For example, we had 90 requests for AP Physics therefore we have 3 sections. Now we have 40 additional requests for AP physics due to students taking online courses over the summer. We have done our best to accommodate students, but many of these courses are now at capacity.

Due to class size restraints and current teacher allocations student requests for the same class in a different period, student requests for a different teacher, student requests for different elective will cannot be granted.

We ask your cooperation and understanding the schedule change requests that we can accommodate are:

- 1. You have a class on your schedule for which you have already earned credit.
- 2. There is a missing class period in your schedule (e.g., no class is printed 3rd Period in schedule).
- 3. You are missing a core subject (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies) needed to meet graduation requirements.
- 4. You are a senior who needs a class to meet graduation requirements
- 5. You did not get scheduled into the next successive year of a program (e.g., were in Spanish 1, need Spanish 2 consecutively)




